2020	I have seen this wine develop and evolve since the very first vintage in 2004. A fruitier style than examples from the earlier years with less oak and more ageing in concrete than before. The result is a more forward style, approachable earlier with very fresh black cherry and strawberry notes, Chinese spice and black pepper. This is a very elegant Chemin de Moscou almost Rhône like, complex yet extremely drinkable. Glad to see the 4% Cinsault is still there. 2019	This is full-throated cherry song, shining-glossy-gleaming with the pure joy of the fruit tumbling, laisser-aller, out the glass. Tannins that feel like the iridescence of pheasant feathers. Pomegranate soprano, sumac spice on the alto with a lick of milk chocolate, rose petals dipped in mica dust on the tenor and petrichor on the bass. 2017	A heady mix of hedgerow fruits, bramble and summer berries following through on the palate to a juicy and really lively concoction of red cherries, jammy blackcurrants and stewed strawberries. These combine with black pepper, hints of cinnamon and soft touches of violets to create a complex and generous mix of flavours. It has a wonderfully soft texture but at the same time is brimming with so much freshness and zing. You also don't feel the 14.5% ABV at all. From old vines, certified organic. 2017	Rich cherry and chocolate nose. Glorious stuff. The fruit sings opera – full-throated, from the depths of its soul, triumphant, full of glory. Holding every note, high and low, with absolute precision and purity. Ripe, velvety cherry and damson fruit on the palate, mocha, sweet souk spices, a touch of orange peel and a now-it's-there-now-it-isn't drift of old mahogany furniture that has been lovingly hand-polished a thousand times. And then this astounding freshness that fills the mouth from beginning to end. It's so generous and open-armed that you could almost drink this without realising how complex it is, and how extraordinarily beautiful the texture is – it <i>feels</i> like a rose petal. Aged 21 months in barrel, it has lots of minerality to go with a core of sweet black cherry fruit, licorice and dried herbs. Forward, sexy and a borderline fruit bomb, it's already hard to resist, and I see no need to hold off. 2012	An outstanding effort, the inky purple colored 2012 Chemin de Moscou checks in as a serious blend of 62 % Syrah, 32 % Grenache and 6 % Cinsault that spent 21 months in barrel; the Syrah in new oak and the Grenache and Cinsault in 1-2-year-old barrels. It has a rocking bouquet of sweet black raspberry, crème de cassis, licorice, crushed flowers and sweet spice. This give way to a medium to full-bodied, pure, elegant effort that has terrific purity of fruit, no hard edges, and a clean, focused finish.
